Daypack:


A lightweight daypack is perfect for carrying water, snacks, a map, and a camera as you explore Ireland's attractions, offering convenient storage without adding extra weight.

Layer clothing for Scotland's varied climate, adapting to changing temperatures while exploring cliffs, historic sites, or enjoying evenings in pubs.






